## Christmas on the School Calendar



As we approach the annual celebration of the birth of our Savior, and cities and counties display traditional Christmas decorations around

town, there are always a few voices in society that cry out, "Separation of church and state!"

A Christian attorney in Springfield, MO, Dee Wampler, recently took action to reverse the national trend of doing away with "Christmas holidays" by calling them "Winter holidays." Wampler found seven school systems near Springfield that did not recognize Christmas. In each town he contacted local pastors and recruited volunteers to attend school board meetings and petitioned them to put Christmas back on the calendar. This kind of action is perfectly legal, under the First Amendment, and it is perfectly Christ-like for churches to come together in support of an historical holiday.

Due to the engagement of these believers, six of the seven school systems changed the calendars back to Christmas holidays! Worries about lawsuits were the main reason there was opposition to the name change, but Wampler said that fear is unfounded. "There has never, ever been a recorded case in history that says you can't recognize Christmas on the calendar," the attorney said.

Let's remember to keep Christ in Christmas!
