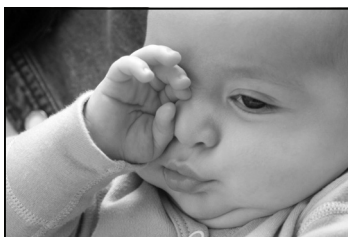

## SJR 127 Clears a Major Hurdle



In May, Senate Joint Resolution 127 will be voted on by the entire state House of Representatives for the first time! This bill would allow the people of Tennessee to

vote on an amendment making the state Constitution neutral once again on abortion. It passed the Senate in March by more than two-thirds. For eight years it had been defeated by a House subcommittee.

In 2000, the Tennessee Supreme Court “found” a fundamental right to abortion in the state Constitution. In addition, *the Court made Tennessee’s Constitution the strongest in the nation in protecting abortion*. And Tennessee’s court is the *only one in the nation to have struck down a legislatively enacted informed consent law!* Other commonsense laws like a 48-hour waiting period were also ruled unconstitutional.

The only way to rectify the Court’s ruling is for the people to vote on a constitutional amendment to once again make our Constitution neutral on abortion. SJR 127 would do just that if approved by the General Assembly twice and placed on the ballot in 2014. It would once again allow abortion to be regulated by *elected* legislators, not five *unelected* justices.

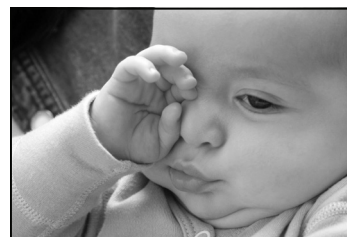

## SJR 127 Clears a Major Hurdle
